Peter Becker Community Residential Living Reopening Guidelines Updated 8.27.2020

Here are the current Peter Becker guidelines for Residential Living on campus. This does not include Personal Care or Skilled Nursing. These guidelines are subject to change based on the state of the community and surrounding county. This document will be updated and distributed accordingly. Please remember these are recommendations based upon resident and staff input, the latest research data and risk analysis for the campus as a whole. 	Blue Phase
Service	The transition to Blue Phase will begin on 7/29/2020. Starting this date, the following recommendations are in
Category	place. These are subject to change at any time.
Worship	- On-campus worship will continue to operate with a 24-person capacity in the Chapel for Sunday in-person
On-Campus	services.
•	- Social distancing and mask wearing should continue.
Visiting	- Visitors are allowed indoors in resident apartments and cottages for Residential Living only (no PC or HCC
On-Campus	residents at this time by state regulation).
	- Masks and social distancing are required for all visitors.
	- Visitors in Ridgeview Estates may not walk through any part of PC or HCC. Please use other routes to travel in
	and out of the building.
	- All visitors on-campus must be screened at the main lobby. If they answer yes to any of the screening questions,
	they will not be allowed to enter campus. Current screening questions are as follows:
	1. Do you have any of the following symptoms:
	*Sore throat *Fever *Cough *Shortness of breath *Loss of taste and smell
	2. Have you been in close contact with or is anyone in your household being treated for or tested for COVID-19?
	3. Have you worked in any facilities with COVID-19 cases without proper PPE?
	4. Have you or have you had prolonged close contact with anyone who has traveled via plane or cruise ship in the last 14 days?5. Have you been, or have you had prolonged close contact with anyone who has traveled to, any of the following states in the
	past 14 days:
	Alabama, Arizona, Arkansas, California, Florida, Georgia, Idaho, Iowa, Kansas, Louisiana, Mississippi, Missouri, Nevada, North Carolina, Oklahoma, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, Utah or Wyoming
	- Doors will continue to be locked after hours when reception is not staffed.
	- Visitors must be escorted by a resident while on campus at all times.
	- No residents or guests should share an elevator with another resident's visitors.
	- Overnight guests are only allowed at this time for certain medical necessities and other extenuating
	circumstances. Prior approval is required.
	- PBC guest rooms are <u>not</u> available for reservations at this time.

- No visitors are allowed in indoor PBC dining venues. Visitors are allowed to dine in the outdoor pavilion at lunch time only (11am- 3:30pm).

- Visitors are allowed in gift shops and the Thrift Shop accompanied by a resident escort.

Travel Off-Campus

Dining:

- Off-campus sit-down dining at restaurants is only recommended outdoors.
- Takeout and delivery from local restaurants is still encouraged.

Shopping:

- Any indoor shopping is allowed. We recommend still going at off-hours or dedicated times for seniors to avoid large crowds.

Medical Appointments:

- Residents continue to be allowed to travel off campus to medical appointments or to seek emergency medical assistance. Doctors may also offer telehealth services.

Visiting:

- Visiting with friends and family is allowed as deemed safe and appropriate by each resident.
- Social distancing and universal mask wearing are still strongly recommended.

Out-of-State Travel:

- If you are traveling out of PA, you will be subject to the latest screening questions upon arrival home. Current screening questions are as follows:
 - 1. Do you have any of the following symptoms:
 - *Sore throat *Fever *Cough *Shortness of breath *Loss of taste and smell
 - 2. Have you been in close contact with or is anyone in your household being treated for or tested for COVID-19?
 - 3. Have you worked in any facilities with COVID-19 cases without proper PPE?
 - 4. Have you or have you had prolonged close contact with anyone who has traveled via plane or cruise ship in the last 14 days?
 - 5. Have you been, or have you had prolonged close contact with anyone who has traveled to, any of the following states in the past 14 days:
 - Alabama, Arkansas, California, Florida, Georgia, Idaho, Kansas, Louisiana, Mississippi, Missouri, Nevada, North Dakota, Oklahoma, South Carolina, Tennessee, & Texas
- If you have traveled anywhere on the restricted state list above or by means of transport that is not allowed by the list, you will have to quarantine in your residence for 14 days.
- Travel to places not on the above list or via means not on the list are not expressly prohibited. Please use your best judgment when making travel decisions as guidelines are constantly changing.

Travel Off-Campus Continued

- Continue to social distance and wear a mask.

Shuttle Service:

- PBC shuttle transportation for shopping, scenic drives and other outings will begin to be scheduled.

Worship:

- In-person worship with an off-campus church or congregation is allowed based on each resident's level of comfort. Services should follow all precautions recommended by the CDC.

Salons:

- Appointments for hair and barber services off-campus are allowed. Masks should continue to be worn.

Dining On-Campus

- Indoor dining will be available in a limited capacity in PBC dining venues.
- Seating will be offered in 3 configurations:
 - Social distancing couples: 2 seats at a table w/more than 6' between the couple (also available for singles)
 - Non-distancing couples (married or cluster): 2 seats at a table w/less than 6' between the couple (available for singles)
 - Cluster table: 3-6 seats at a table with residents of the same cluster
- Courtyard at the Ridge will be open to Residential Living residents only. WVC and PC@RV residents will dine in the room adjacent to CYAR.
- Up to 4 visitors are allowed in the Season's Café to get takeout or dine in with a resident.
- We continue to recommend you socially distance from your visitors when dining with them.
- A resident couple can only have a maximum of 4 visitors between them to accommodate the maximum seating of 6 per table.
- No visitors are allowed in Gardenview or Courtyard to dine.
- Groceries remain available for order.
- Takeout and dine-in nights scheduled by PBC will continue.
- Outdoor dining will be available in the pavilion on Wednesdays for dinner only with shuttle transportation to and from.
- Clusters may dine together at a table within 6 ft of one another if so desired. Others are recommended to dine with social distancing.
- Dining will cater events with up to 6 visitors/guests based on available space and ability to social distance.
- Call ext. 4044 to schedule an event.

Life	- Activities that can be engaged in while maintaining 6 ft distance and wearing masks (unless outside) are allowed.
Enrichment	This includes movies, walking, outdoor games, bingo, etc.
	- Resident-led clubs and groups can meet with a maximum of 25 people. Residents must be at least 6 ft apart.
	Meetings must be scheduled in common areas.
	- Common area puzzles will be reopened with certain limitations. Only one resident, with a mask on, should work
	on the puzzle at a time. Hands should be sanitized before and after use.
Clusters	- Residents are encouraged to form social clusters of up to 6 people that agree upon a set of rules and allowable
	activities within the cluster (a worksheet is available for resident use with more details).
	- Residents can only join one cluster and cannot switch clusters.
	- Residents should continue to follow all other PBC guidelines when performing activities or meeting with others
	outside of their cluster.
Outside	- Any outside medical professionals, caregivers and other providers are allowed on campus if they pass our
Specialists,	screening process and can show proof of a recent negative COVID-19 test result.
·	- Outside specialists are beginning to schedule appointments again in the Campus Center Medical Suite. Please
Providers &	follow the regular process for making an appointment.
Vendors	- Univest Bank and Harleysville Bank will not return to campus at this time. Harleysville Bank offers early morning
	hours to seniors from 8:30-9am at their community locations.
	- Other outside vendors will be assessed on an as-needed basis to determine if they can be permitted on campus.
Volunteers	- Resident volunteers are allowed in both gift shops and the Thrift Shop.
	- No volunteering is allowed in Personal Care or Skilled Nursing areas at this time.
	- Outside volunteers will be allowed to come onto campus at this time by specific approval only.
Beauty Shop	- The PBC Beauty Shop remains open. Call to schedule an appointment.
